Navigating Medicare

Bonus Bucks

In this and the next newsletter, I'm going to address a couple commonly missed entitlements that could increase your Social Security benefit. You are entitled to extra earnings credits for military service years between 1940 and 2001. After 1968, those credits were automatically added to your earnings each year. If you had active duty years prior to January 1969, it's very important that you notify the SSA (Social Security Administration) of your months in the military. You'll have to present a certified copy of your DD-214. I advise you to always visit your local Social Security Office for any discussion about Social Security or Medicare matters. When it comes to complex issues, I've never gotten satisfactory results from the folks at 1-800-772-1213.

You will be credited with \$300 in additional earnings for each calendar quarter in which you received active duty pay from 1957 through 1968. In other words, \$1,200 will be added to your earnings for each full year you served. For some years, it may more than double your earnings. The SSA adjusts past earnings to the Current Price Index when calculating benefits, so \$1,200 in the 1960s may be equivalent to \$12,000 or more today. Typically, servicemen will find their adjusted earnings for those years now exceed \$25,000, which can put those years in your top 35 income years, from which your benefit is calculated.

Prior to 1957, the SSA did not tax military personnel on active duty. So they later generously credited servicemen \$160 for each month of active duty. Adjusted earnings for some of those years could exceed \$50,000.

If you had active duty prior to January1969, I strongly recommend you download the Detailed Calculator that the SSA uses to calculate your benefit, and do the calculations yourself. Go to <u>www.ssa.gov/OACT/anypia/download.html</u>, and follow instructions. I've found that the SSA has not always accurately entered dates for military service. You may find that you are entitled to hundreds of dollars more a month.

Every state has a federally sponsored Agency on Aging that will give you free and unbiased help with selecting comprehensive Medicare coverage. The link to find the agency in your area can be found at <u>www.eldercare.gov/Eldercare.NET/Public/Index.aspx</u>.
